

COUNCIL TO REVISIT RETIREE HEALTH CARE AT MAY 16 COUNCIL

MEETING: City Council members will revisit a phase out of city contributions toward medical-insurance premiums paid by retirees until its May 16 regular meeting. No vote was taken on the proposal that would phase out the City's share of medical insurance costs to retired workers by 2014. Council members did agree to give staff time to come up with options for retirees, and also agreed on the following:

- Full cost of the retiree health care will be determined on a three-tier basis of single, two party and family;
- Exceptions should be made for those retirees with a lesser income, and;
- At some point to be determined, the City's contribution will be phased out. For the staff report, click here.

BIKE LANES ON MINERAL KING, NOBLE TO STAY: Council approved the bike lanes that have been installed on Mineral King and Noble Avenues, between Mooney Boulevard and Akers Street, per the approved bike plan. They also directed staff to work with property owners interested in developing alternative "off-street" parking options along these bike routes, which would be designed, constructed and paid for by the property owners. The bike lanes, installed in March, will improve connectivity and coverage for bicycles, and were originally adopted by Council in the 2006 City of Visalia Bikeway Plan and was reaffirmed in the 2011 Plan. The lanes were installed using a Bicycle Transportation Account grant obtained in October 2008. Business owners had been given written notice during the site plan review process for their facilities that on-street parking could be eliminated in the future. OTHER COUNCIL NEWS: City Manager Steve Salomon presented a status report on the Tulare County Economic Development Corporation and the City's work with other organizations to urge TCEDC to make improvements in their performance and accountability. For more information, click here... A Neighborhood Traffic Management Program was approved to be funded at an amount not to exceed \$50,000 from the Gas Tax Fund. Council approved the removal of local amendments regarding fire sprinklers in non-residential buildings and to apply fire sprinkler standards contained in the 2010 or most recently adopted California Fire Code. For more information, click here. A settlement has been reached between the City and Citizens For Responsible Planning. The association had sought to overturn changes in zoning which allowed supermarkets 30,000 square feet or smaller as a permitted use along the Mooney Boulevard Commercial corridor. Council adopted an ordinance on April 18 which reversed the prior decision as it relates to the supermarkets and allowed the dismissal.

APRIL 30 IS DRUG TAKE BACK DAY: Turn in your unused or expired medication and vitamins for free, safe disposal on Saturday, April 30, National Drug Take Back Day, at 11 locations throughout Tulare County. The U.S. Drug Enforcement Administration and local law enforcement agencies are providing the public with the opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by disposing, free of charge, potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription and over-the-counter medication (including pet medication), both in pill and liquid form, and unused vitamins. Place pills, capsules, and tablets of unwanted medication and vitamins into a zip-lock plastic bag. Keep liquid medication in its original container. Medication from hospitals, pharmacies, doctor's offices, etc., will not be accepted.

GENERAL PLAN UPDATE MOVES INTO SECOND PHASE: The General Plan is a long-range planning and policy document which guides city growth and public services. The 25-member General Plan Update Review Committee is leading this effort. Topics to be addressed include: Land use, transportation, street patterns, parks and open space, public services, city design, noise, safety, conservation, and air quality. The Plan is now at the stage where several different "growth concepts" – maps showing the potential locations of future housing, job centers, parks, schools, greenbelts, transit and other amenities – are being prepared. They show a range of concepts to guide future growth and development in Visalia.
