BUILDING PERMITS DOWN 3%, VALUE UP 25%: The number of new building permits for commercial projects is up 37% for the year through October and new residential additions and alteration permits are up 16%. Total valuation of all permits is up 25% for the year—from \$95,246,312 in 2010 to \$119,000,070 through October in 2011. Permits for new single family dwellings are down 33%, and new multi-family permits are down 25%.

When a prohibition is declared, burning any solid fuel in a residential fireplace or wood-burning device is not permitted and violations are subject to fines. Winter air quality is affected by a mix of extremely small particles from dust, smoke and soot and exhaust from heavy-duty trucks and other vehicles. POLICE DEPARTMENT PLACES IN STATEWIDE TRAFFIC SAFETY **COMPETITION:** The Visalia Police Department placed second out of 14 law enforcement

agencies of similar size in the California Law Enforcement Challenge, a friendly competition between California law enforcement agencies striving to reach new goals each year in traffic safety. Each year, a panel of independent traffic safety experts from across the country review and judge each application. The best submissions are recognized for their overall traffic safety programs. The department placed within the category of 106-160 sworn officers. Statistics are as follows: Seat Belt Citations, 1604; Child Safety Seat Citations, 82; Speed Citations, 1872, and; DUI arrests, 1012.

development and approved the bidding of the new Animal Care Center project once the documents are completed. Council also authorized staff to enter into negotiations with partner cities who desire to cover their share of the use of the new facility and to solicit funding from local lending institutions. The Animal Care Center is part of an overall proposed campus which will ultimately include the Valley Oak SPCA Adoption and Education center, which is to be funded with private funds raised by the non-profit. The current program design accommodates an average of 15,000 animals a year. Of that, roughly twothirds are from the City. Prior to the construction of the new shelter, the City will need a financial commitment from other cities who are using the facility or modify the size to accommodate only those willing to partner. A phasing plan, consisting of a core administrative and intake area and several kennel pods can be constructed initially or at a later date, and can be expanded to accommodate more animals should the need arise. The total cost is estimated to be about \$7 million and as designed would serve the Cities of Visalia, Tulare, Dinuba, Farmersville, and Exeter. Each city is being asked to commit to cover their pro-rated share of the cost and will be required to sign a 20-year agreement. COUNCIL APPOINTS TASK FORCE MEMBERS; MAYOR NAMES

CITY MOVES FORWARD ON PLANNING NEW 9-1-1 **COMMUNICATIONS CENTER:** An internal Core Project Committee is established and

will meet weekly to study and implement a new 9-1-1 Communications Center/Public Safety Building. Council had previously directed staff to proceed with the project as a solo City Venture as opposed to a co-located concept with the County. In its preliminary assessment, the committee will: Review available sites and assess their suitability for the new center and identify other services that could be co-located at

the new center. The Committee will provide regular reports on the status of the project. A December report could include a recommendation to approve an RFP to identify a Project Manager. The City plans

to build at least a 9-1-1 Communications Center on City-owned property in the east downtown area.

Visalia residents are invited to exchange up to 5 of their old incandescent holiday lights for new, energy efficient LED strands – for free! Come on out to the Downtown Visalia Open House event scheduled for Saturday December 3rd and be sure to stop by 207 W. Main St. (in front of Nature's

Pharmacy) between 11 am and 3 pm. Don't forget to bring up to 5 strands of incandescent holiday lights and exchange them for new LED lights - for free. Five hundred strands of new LED lights are available through this exchange program, which is administered by the City of Visalia and its partnership with Southern California Edison under the auspices of the California Public Utilities Commission. Exchanges

are first-come, first –served, while supplies last. If you plan to use lights to decorate during the holiday season, make the switch to LEDs. Some more reasons to make the switch: LEDs reduce energy consumption by as much as 95% compared to traditional incandescent A typical 50-bulb incandescent strand of lights uses 250 watts and an equivalent 70-bulb LED strand uses only three watts: LEDs can produce bright light for up to 20 holiday seasons; LEDs do not give off heat like conventional decorative bulbs, reducing the risk of fire, and; LEDs are more durable, perform well in cold weather, and provide brighter and bolder light

fires. Over half of these deaths (52%) occur between the hours of 10 pm and 7 am, when residents are typically sleeping. The majority of fire victims die or are injured from exposure to smoke and toxic gases, such as carbon monoxide. In addition, smoke obscures vision, decreasing your ability to escape. Test your alarms every month (press the test button). Change batteries at least once a year. (Pick a date you will remember: when you change your
