# GOT DRUGS? TURN IN UNUSED, EXPIRED MEDICATIONS

The United States Drug Enforcement Administration and local law enforcement agencies are providing the public with an opportunity to prevent pill abuse and theft by ridding their homes of potentially dangerous expired, unused, and unwanted prescription and over-the-counter medication (including pet medication), both in pill and liquid form as well as unused vitamins during the 4<sup>th</sup> week in September.

Place pills, capsules, and tablets of unwanted medication and vitamins into a zip-lock plastic bag. Keep liquid medication in its original container then place it in a zip-lock plastic bag. Medication from hospitals, pharmacies, doctor's offices, etc., will not be accepted.

This is a free event for all residents of Tulare County. The public is encouraged to drop off unwanted medication and vitamins. For information on times and days to participate, call the appropriate law enforcement agency listed below:
