The Council Members ask that you keep your comments brief and positive. Creative criticism, presented with appropriate courtesy, is welcome. The Council cannot legally discuss or take official action on citizen request items that are introduced tonight. In fairness to all who wish to speak tonight, each speaker from the public will be allowed three minutes (speaker timing lights mounted on the lectern will notify you with a flashing red light when your time has expired). Please begin your comments by stating and spelling your name and providing your address.

CHANGES TO THE AGENDA/ITEMS TO BE PULLED FOR DISCUSSION

- 5. CONSENT CALENDAR Consent Calendar items are considered routine and will be enacted by a single vote of the Council with no discussion. For a Consent Calendar item to be discussed, or voted upon individually, it must be removed at the request of the Council.
- a) Authorization to read ordinances by title only.
- b) Authorization for the City Manager to execute an agreement with the College of Sequoias that provides for participation in the Federal Work Study Program.
- c) Authorization for the approval of the 2004/05 transit agreement with Tulare County.
- d) **Introduction of Ordinance 2004-24** authorizing the approval of an amendment to the Dr. Stephen J. McAuliff Lease at 1549 W. Main, Mayor's Park.
- e) Authorization to accept a grant award for \$60,000 from the Office of Homeland Security, Homeland Security Grant Program; and to approve the expenditure of the Homeland Security Grant Program funds for the purchase of a robot for the Visalia Police Department Bomb Squad; and appropriate \$60,000 in recognition of the grant.
- f) Authorization to appropriate in asset forfeiture funds \$50,417.96 and authorize the purchase of 51 Taser X26 units in the amount of \$50,417.96.
- g) Authorization for the approval of the Visalia Veterans Day Committee 2004 World War II Mural to be located on the west wall of the Buckman Mitchell Insurance Building, 309 W. Main Street.
- h) Authorization for the Mayor to sing a one-year contract extension with City Manager Steve Salomon through June 30, 2005.
- i) Authorize the City Manager to apply for an alternative fuel vehicle grant in the amount of \$373,900 for 7 CNG Solid Waste trucks and 6 CNG transit buses from The San Joaquin Valley Air Pollution Control District's (SJVAPCD) Heavy-Duty Engine Emission Reduction Incentive Program.

- j) Authorization for City Staff to request a minor amendment of the LAFCO Sphere of Influence to the Tulare County LAFCO. The amendment would redraw the current Sphere to include the subject sites for Annexation No. 2004-06 (Wild Horse Ranch), located on the northwest corner of Demaree Street and Avenue 316. (APN: 077-050-15,16) **Resolution 2004-80 required**.
- k) Authorization for the temporary suspension of an additional 25% of building permit fees to be effective August 9, 2004; and continuing through August 31, 2005, after which the full building permit fee schedule adopted in March 2001 will automatically go into effect.
- Authorization for the Formation or Annexation of the following Landscape and Lighting District:
 - 1. The Ranch #4 into Landscape and Lighting Act Assessment No. 03-23, The Ranch No.'s 1, 2 & 3, and rename the district "The Ranch No.'s 1-4" **Resolution 2004-78 and 2004-79 required**.
- m) Authorization to record the final map for the following:
 - 1. The Ranch Unit No. 4 Subdivision, located on the southwest corner of the Houston Avenue and Chinowth Street intersection. APN. 077-090-030

 - 1. Parcel Map 2002-11, located West of Mooney Blvd. between Packwood Creek and Visalia Parkway.

6. CONTINUED PUBLIC HEARING -

Appeal of the Planning Commission's denial of Conditional Use Permit No. 2004-12, a request by Harold Clements (California Planning and Engineering, agent) to allow a planned residential development with narrow public streets and flag lots on cul-de-sacs. This site is located on the northwest corner of McAuliff Street and Tulare Avenue (APN: 101-050-05, 11) **Resolution 2004-72 required**.

Appeal of the Planning Commission's denial of McAuliff Meadows Vesting Tentative Subdivision Map, a request by Harold Clements (California Planning and Engineering, agent) to divide 35.4 acres into 159 lots. This site is located on the northwest corner of McAuliff Street and Tulare Avenue (APN: 101-050-05, 11) **Resolution 2004-71 required**.

- 7. REGULAR ITEM Presentations by the Community Development Department and Police Department regarding public infrastructure improvements, development projects, and public safety programs in Visalia.
- 8. PUBLIC HEARING to approve the recommended expenditure of the 2004 Federal Local Law Enforcement Block Grant (LLEBG) funds of \$61,140 to continue funding two Police Officer positions and appropriating \$61,140 in recognition of the grant.
- 9. PUBLIC HEARING Appeal of the Planning Commission's denial of Conditional Use Permit No. 2004-22, a request to allow a 20-unit apartment complex. The property is located at 213 N. Hall Street (APN: 093-261-01, 08). *Staff recommends that the Council approve applicant's request to refer item back to the Planning Commission.*

General Plan Amendment No. 2004-14: a request to change the land use designation on .7 acres from Low Density Residential and Professional / Administrative Office to Neighborhood Commercial. **Resolution No. 2004-77 required**.

Change of Zone No. 2004-15: a request to change the zoning on .7 acres from R-1-6 (Single-family Residential) and PA (Professional / Administrative Office) to C-N (Neighborhood Commercial). **Introduction of Ordinance No. 2004-23 required**.

Certify Negative Declaration No. 2003-49
