Sharon Seltzer reviewed the agreement. Seltzer recommended that the council sign the agreement.

Council discussed the project. Don Landers recommended that traffic signal coordination be added to the agreement. Greg Kirkpatrick said he has issue with the language stating the fact of global warming; Greg Collins said he is in support of the agreement; Bob Link agrees with the concept but has some issues with it and wants more information so he will abstain from the vote; Jesus Gambob said it is a flexible document where we can control the outcome and objectives and is a good program.

Comments from the Public: Vicki Stasch, Brian Raul, Mario Orosco, Dean Mann, Martin Baninno spoke in support of the Council signing the agreement.

15. Update from Police Chief Bob Carden regarding his first eight months as Chief, including partnerships with other City departments and agencies, and the outcomes from the recent senior staff goal setting session.

Police Chief Bob Carden reviewed the department's mission statement and their organizational structure. Carden will be reorganizing the department and will have his draft to the City Manager later this month. Carden reviewed the department's objectives regarding gang issues and reviewed the accomplishments that he has seen in the department during his past eight months. Carden reviewed the partnerships that the Police Department has with other city departments and other agencies.

Councilmen responded that they are pleased with the job Carden is doing, commended him and his department, and applaud his emphasis on training and collaboration, his visibility in uniform, and responsiveness to inquiries. Councilman Kirkpatrick asked for a gang intervention task force update for a meeting in January or February.
