Ricardo Noguera, Housing & Economic Development Director and Jim Harbottle, consultant representing the city, presented summary and background information regarding the Visalia Model Lease Program which will sunset on May 16, 2010. The request to come before Council for public discussion came originally from the Mobile Home Task Force with a proposal for implementing a rent control ordinance which is opposed by the park owners. Staff is asking for direction from the Council to determine whether to continue participating in mobile home issues and whether to retain the services of a consultant to complete a study designed to implement a solution and to explore the possibility of assuming responsibility for enforcement of state and local codes in mobile home parks.
