SUBJECT: 2008 Park Ranger Annual Review

#### **BACKGROUND:**

In March 2007, the city initiated a Park Ranger program in the City of Visalia. The Park Ranger is a full-time employee of the City and performs specific law enforcement duties in all of the City's parks.

The Ranger has the authority to issue citations for specific violations but is not armed. In addition to the law enforcement activities, the Park Ranger performs many types of maintenance and construction tasks, as well as public relations duties.

The Ranger works a regular forty hour-a-week schedule. Thirty two of those hours are spent in Park Maintenance and the other eight hours as a Park Ranger enforcing laws and order during the weekends only. Those hours will increase to 16 hours per week once the water feature's maintenance is outsourced to a private company.

The following details activity related to law enforcement duties performed by the Park Ranger on Saturdays and Sundays for the period March 1, 2008 through October 26, 2008.

In addition, the Park Ranger has been an effective resource at the new Riverway Sports Park attending to the water feature, arbor issues and weekend events.

Historically, the Park Ranger will spend an average of 8 hours of his time dealing with law enforcement issues. The remaining time is spent in park maintenance and construction.

The following outlines some of the benefits of the Park Ranger program since its inception:

- 1) Reduction in vandalism which has led to the savings of material and labor.
- 2) Reduction in loitering and violators of park rules. The families are returning to our parks and feeling safer about the park atmosphere.
- 3) Increased satisfaction to our arbor renters. The presence of the Ranger has been an asset when dealing with rental issues, bounce houses and alcohol consumption.
- 4) Enhanced the relationship between Visalia Police Department and the Parks & Recreation divisions.

## City of Visalia Special Event Application

#### WELCOME

The City of Visalia's Special Event process is designed to ensure that your event is successful while taking into consideration the protection of the public's health and safety. Thank you for your interest in our community, and we wish you the best with your special event.

#### WHAT CONSTITUTES A SPECIAL EVENT?

Any organized activity involving the use of, or having impact upon, public property, facilities, public parks, sidewalks or street areas.

#### ARE THERE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH HOSTING A SPECIAL EVENT?

Usually there are additional costs associated with the hosting of any special event, in particular, assistance required from Police, Fire, or Public Works staff. Rental payments for city facilities or parks will also be required.

#### APPLICATION TIMELINE AND PROCESS

- 1. A completed application may be filed as early as *one year* before the event, but must be received to the Parks and Recreation Department no later than **sixty (60)** days prior to the event. (Events that are turned in after the required timeline are not guaranteed to be ready by the event date.)
- 2. It is recommended that applicants set up a meeting with Committee Chairman, John Bradley to review needed items on special event committee.
- 3. The application will be reviewed by the Special Event Committee. This committee is composed of professionals from various city departments. The sponsor of the event will be invited to a Special Events Committee meeting to review their event.
- 4. The Special Event Committee Chairman will assist the sponsor to assure all required elements of the application are completed.
- 5. Event sponsor will be given a "summary checklist" to assure that all required elements are completed.
