FIVE VIE FOR COUNCIL VACANCY: Five Visalians will be invited to interview with City Council members at 4 p.m. on Monday, June 27, to fill the vacant Council seat. The five are: Adam Peck; Milton Morrison; Luke Feldstein; Don Sharp; and Jim Robinson. Each will get 5-10 minutes to discuss their qualifications, followed by questions from Council members. The interviews are open to the public, however candidates are asked not be in chambers until after they have met with Council. If the City Council chooses to make an appointment, the appointee would only serve until a permanent successor is elected at the November 2011 election. The Council may eventually decide to not appoint a successor and instead allow the seat only to be filled during the November 2011 election. In a related move, the Council voted to place the vacant office on the November ballot. The candidate receiving the third highest number of votes in that City election will fill the unexpired term which will end in November 2013.

COUNCIL ADOPTS BUDGET AMENDMENTS; POLICE, FIRE SEE STAFF REDUC-

TIONS: Low sales tax revenues contributing to a reduced Measure T fund led Council to adopt budget amendments that reduce the number of police officers by three and the hiring of 14 future firefighters to 11. Measure T, the quartercent sales tax increase, has added 28 police officers and four firefighters since it passed in 2004. Council approved the cuts of three officer positions through attrition and agreed to move three positions from Measure T to the General Fund. Council also approved \$950,000 in budget reduction and a one-time use of \$475,000 in reserves to reduce a \$1.4 million budget deficit for Fiscal Year 2011-12. COUNCIL ADJUSTS RATES, FEES: Council approved new fees and fee increases and decreases to the following services: Administrative; business tax; Convention Center; Community Development; Engineering; impact fees; Parks & Recreation; and Public Works. IN OTHER COUNCIL NEWS: The City Council took action to certify the final Environmental Impact Report (EIR) and upheld the Planning Commission's approval of the Conditional Use Permit for the expansion of the existing Wal-Mart at Noble, east of Ben Maddox, and variance for business signage, and added several conditions to address land use concerns raised by residents in the area, including hours of loading and unloading.

COOLING CENTER OPEN THROUGH JUNE 23: The City of Visalia will open its Transit Center as a Cooling Center for the community's use from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. through Thursday, June 23. The Transit Center, at 425 E. Oak Ave., provides amenities such as ample seating, vending machines, and restrooms. All of the bus routes eventually lead to the Transit Center, providing convenient transportation. The Visalia Fire Department offers the following tips to cope with the heat:

- Avoid prolonged exposure to the sun and, when possible, stay in the shade or an air-conditioned room;
- Wear loose fitting, light-colored clothes;

- Never leave children or pets in a vehicle, even for short periods of time, as temperatures inside vehicles can rapidly climb to live-threatening levels, even with the windows partially open;
- Periodically check on children and the elderly;
- Remember that animals are affected by the heat and make sure they have plenty of water and access to shade.
