# **City Updates**

#### **Recruitment Open Until March 28 for Planning Commission Positions:**

Applications are being accepted until March 28 for three positions on the Visalia Planning Commission. Three Planning Commission terms will end June 30, 2012. Two of the current Commissioners, Larry Segure and Terese Lane, are eligible for reappointment. The third commissioner, Vincent Salinas, has served more than eight years and is not eligible for reappointment. The Planning Commission makes recommendations to the City Council concerning land use, building, subdivisions, administers the Zoning Ordinance and handles matters that affect the growth and development of Visalia. The Commission meets on the second and fourth Monday of each month at 7:00 p.m. Additional work sessions and meetings may be scheduled to address specific matters. This position requires the filing of a Fair Political Practices Commission Conflict of Interest Form (Form 700). Recruitment will continue until Wednesday, March 28, at 5 p.m. Interviews, which are open to the public, would be held on Monday, April 9, beginning at 4 p.m. The format of those interviews would depend upon the number of applications received. The Council would consider formally appointing the 3 Planning Commissioners on April 16, for the term beginning July 1, 2012 and ending June 30, 2014. ### **Council Meeting Recaps**

**City Shows SMART Side:** Cleaning up some of the City's struggling neighborhoods can be a messy job, but the SMART team appears up to the task nicely. During its seventh semi-annual update since it formed three years ago, the SMART team (which stands for Specific, Measurable, Achievable, Relevant, and Timebound) touted their efforts and accomplishments from July 1 through Dec. 31, 2011. The Team consists of staff from police, fire, parks & recreation, and code enforcement which target problem properties which are the subject of multiple citizen complaints. The impressive results from the six-month effort revealed:

- 855 complaints on substandard housing were down 893 in the last half of the year;
- 136 felonies, down 184 from 2010, were reported in the Oval area;
- Burglaries fell by 40 percent in the Washington School area;
- 1,205 cases of graffiti were abated citywide, comparable to the 1,290 cases abated the first half of the year, with a significant number of cases within City parks, and;
- \$356,292 in fines were levied by the City.

### New Attendance Policy Takes Effect April 1 for City Committees,

**Commissions:** With the optimum goal of preventing the cancellation of meetings due to a lack of quorum, the Council approved a new attendance policy that automatically removes a member of a City Committee or Commission if four meetings are missed in a 12-month period. Concerns about meetings being canceled due to the absence of a voting majority of members prompted the change. A subcommittee of the mayor and vice mayor could grant exceptions. The new policy takes effect April 1, and replaces the City's current policy which allowed for excused absences for members due to work, health or family commitments.

**Other Council News:** In other Council action, a City Council Electronic Communications Policy was approved. With the implementation of an Agenda Management System, Council members will soon receive and review Council agenda packets electronically and conduct meetings using an iPad. The policy outlines parameters for the Council to not have access to information during the meeting that could influence their decision without members of the public having access to the same information as part of the decision-making process.
