CITIZENS REQUESTS - This is the time for members of the public to comment on any matter within the jurisdiction of the Visalia City Council. Christie Burnett from Young at Heart asked the Council to continue waving the fees for the evening dances at the Senior Center. The matter was referred to staff.

Don Hutton, 300 W. School thanked the Council for helping establish the Samaritian Center which celebrated its 1 year anniversary over the weekend. The organization provided medical assistance to 389 people in September.

Bill Dillberg, Chair of the Parks and Recreation Commission was honored for his volunteer work for the City and especially for his assistance in locating unclaimed funds. Vice Mayor Phil Cox announced that the City has received a Brownsfield Grant from the United States EPA to identify sites in East Downtown that could be prepared for clean up. Visalia was the only Valley city to receive this grant.

<u>General Plan Amendment No. 2004-20:</u> A request to reconfigure the land use designations on 40 acres, located on the northeast corner of Riggin Avenue and Dinuba Boulevard. (APN: 079-071-06, 07, 08, 09, 10, 11, 19, 21[portion]) North Visalia Development LLC and Francis Gruber, applicants; Forester Weber & Associates, agent. **Resolution 2004- 334 required**.

Initiation of proceedings for <u>Annexation No. 2004-07 (Riggin-Dinuba NE):</u> A request to annex 11 parcels totaling 80.31 acres into the City of Visalia, located on the northeast corner of

Riggin Avenue and Dinuba Boulevard. (APN: 079-071-06, 07, 08, 09, 10, 11, 19, 21[portion]) North Visalia Development LLC and Francis Gruber, applicants; Forester Weber & Associates, agent. **Resolution 2004-335required**.

Certify Negative Declaration No. 2004-100.

Everett Hughes, No. Visalia Investments spoke in favor of his project, noting that with the number of houses in this area, commercial development is appropriate.

Craig Mangano, 5925 W. Elowin Dr. spoke in opposition to the Amendment. He felt that a large big-box retailer would go on the property and be detrimental to the area.

The Council asked several questions and moved to continue the item so the questions can be researched and to see if some reasonable agreements could be reached.

#### 12. PUBLIC HEARING -

- a. Appeal of the Planning Commission's denial of Emerald Creek Tentative Subdivision Map, a request to divide 14.6 acres into 46 lots for single-family and multi-family residential use with Remainder lots. This site is located on the south side of Noble Avenue, approximately 1/3 mile east of McAuliff Street. (APN: 101-060-02). Applicants: Kevin Fistolera and Bob Ausherman; agent: Forester Weber & Associates. **Resolution No. 2004-336 required.**
- b. Appeal of the Planning Commission's denial of Conditional Use Permit No. 2004-41, a request to allow a planned residential development of single-family, duplex, triplex, and four-plex townhouses. This site is located on the south side of Noble Avenue, approximately 1/3 mile east of McAuliff Street. (APN: 101-060-02). Applicants: Kevin Fistolera and Bob Ausherman; agent: Forester Weber & Associates. **Resolution No. 2004-337 required.**

Bob Ausherman, Forester Weber & Associates, spoke in favor of the project, promising to make it a quality development that will help fill-in the area.

Randy Forrester, Forester Weber & Associates also spoke in favor of the project and addressed the Council's questions.

Chris Smith, 4137 E. Noble spoke in opposition of the project, citing the traffic problems in the area.

Michael McPhail, 1348 S. Rio Linda spoke against the project because of the additional traffic that it would bring.

Susan Salsh, 926 S. Rio Linda spoke against the project because she is concerned about traffic and safety

Robert Vitali, 846 S. Grand spoke against the project because of traffic concerns Ed Canvasser, 724 N. Ben Maddox questioned why the Council would consider approving this project when they had turned down a similar project that his firm represented earlier this year. The Council concurred with the public comment that traffic is a problem, noting that Cal Trans will have to address the problems in that area, and due to the state's negative budget situation, road projects are behind schedule. The Council noted that the developers in this area had been given a green light to move ahead some time ago with the understanding that the state road projects would be forthcoming. The property owners have invested considerable time and money into developing projects and the Council did not feel it would be fair to delay their projects. The Council did direct staff to install a 3-way stop sign at Noble in order to alleviate some of the traffic and safety problems.

GK/DL 4-0 Approved with the provision that a 3-way stop be at Noble.

#### 13. PUBLIC HEARING -

DL/PC 4-0 Approved General Plan Amendment No. 2004-24. A request by the City of Visalia to change the Land Use Designation from Agricultural to Quasi Public for approximately 37 acres. The site is located on the Southeast corner of County Center Street and Cameron Avenue. APN: 126-050-001, 126-277-005 (portion). **Resolution No. 2004-338 required**.

**Introduction of Ordinance 2004-33** Change of Zone No. 2004-23. A request by the City of Visalia to change the Zoning from Agricultural (A) to Quasi Public (QP) for approximately 37 acres.

The site is located on the Southeast corner of County Center Street and Cameron Avenue. APN: 126-050-001, 126-277-005 (portion).
