- Review proposed 2018 Action Plan activities & funding; Review 2017 CDBG funding requiring reprogramming; and
- Obtain public input on proposed programs/activities and uncommitted funding in order to prepare Draft 2018 Action Plan and 2017 Amendment

The goal of this information is to provide the public with an overview of HUD's requirements to meet their National Objectives and Outcomes with the use of CDBG and HOME funding.

Each year the City receives CDBG and HOME funding to utilize toward programs/projects that meet the high priority needs identified in the Strategic Plan specifically in Visalia. This is achieved through successful programs, projects and activities.

Before preparing the Draft 2018 Action Plan, we review the proposed projects with the community and gain public input.

We would like to receive your feedback (input) on the proposed use for 2018 CDBG & HOME funding, as well as 2017 CDBG funds (approx. \$144k) remaining from a completed project which requires the funds to be reprogrammed into an existing 2017 project.

 - The balances reflected (total commitment of \$1,488,721 toward projects) are committed by contract to non-profit agencies, Staffing, and contractors who are providing services toward the high priority need. The balance will be disbursed through June 30, 2018.
- The 2017 HOME projects & programs provides a general idea of recommended 2018 HOME activities for the fourth year for the period of July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019.
- The Table includes an estimated \$371,694 in 2018 HOME funds, plus an estimated \$150,000 in program income is anticipated. This is only an estimate based on the current year funding received from HUD, along with loan payments (program income) received previously.
- Priorities being addressed are:
 - Affordable Housing adding:
 - \$319,525 to SHE CHDO Acq/Rehab or new construction; and estimated \$150k in anticipated program income during the next year



This table reflects:

- The prior balance committed of \$1,422,385 (as of 12-26-17) is carried over to complete the projects currently underway and previous approved. These are funds committed by contract to non-profit agencies, Staffing, and contractors who are providing services toward the high priority need. The balance will be disbursed through June 30, 2018.
- The 2017 CDBG projects & programs provide a general idea of recommended 2018 CDBG activities for the fourth year for the period of July 1, 2018, through June 30, 2019.
- For 2018 CDBG funding estimated is \$1,188,919, plus an estimated \$25,000 in program income anticipated. However, this is only an estimate based on the current year funding received from HUD, along with loan payments (program income) received previously.
- Priorities being addressed are:
 - Affordable Housing adding:
 - \$70,000- Senior Mobile Home Repair Program Contract with Self Help
 - \$115,000- Code Enforcement
 - · Public Services adding:
 - \$7,500 Fair Housing-Contract with Fair Housing Council of Central CA.
 - \$25,575- Voucher Program- Contract with Family Services
 - \$17,000- Continuum of Care- Contract with Alliance
 - \$40,000- Street Outreach/Case Management- Contract with Family Services
 - Public & Park Improvements adding:
 - \$476,061-plus estimated \$20k in Program Income for Public ADA Improvements
 - \$50,000- Parks-

A total potential balance reflects prior balance commitments plus the 2018 estimated budget with commitments.

An additional \$150,000 is included in this balance, however, is uncommitted and available to direct toward a high priority need. Staff recommends adding to ADA compliance or Parks. Your input is needed.


Approximately \$143k in CDBG funds will remain after the last payment of the Section 108 loan. This estimated remaining balance must be reprogrammed to another CDBG project/program.

Staff recommends redirect approximately \$143K of 2017 CDBG funding toward CDBG- ADA Project to continue projects design and construction (2017 CDBG Action Plan Amendment)

Upon making the last Section 108 loan principle and interest payments, Staff proposes directing the remaining CDBG funds (approximately \$143k) to CDBG ADA Compliance Projects to assist with completing design and construction. This will close out the use of CDBG funds toward the Section 108 loan and add to the existing Accessibility compliance public improvement needs
