- 3. MEETING MINUTES
 - A. April 23, 2025, Regular Meeting

A motion was made by Melgar, seconded by Lusk, to approve the meeting minutes. The motion was approved 6-0.

B. May 14, 2025, Regular Meeting

A motion was made by Lusk, seconded by Hohlbauch, to approve the meeting minutes. The motion was approved 6-0.

4. PROJECT REVIEW

A. <u>HPAC Item No. 2025-08</u>: A request by Clarence Hill to install a new wrought iron fence for an office, located within the D-MU (Mixed Use Downtown) Zone. The project site is located at 301 West School Avenue (APN: 094-332-004).

Staff presented its report and recommended that the HPAC approve the request as conditioned by staff. Public comment in favor of the proposal was provided by project consultant Ruben Mendoza. No other public comment was received.

After discussion of the project, a motion was made by Melgar, seconded by Lusk, to approve the request as recommended by staff. The motion passed by a vote of 6-0

B. <u>HPAC Item No. 2025-09</u>: A request by Eddie Sisto to remove and install awnings for an office, located within the D-MU (Mixed Use Downtown) Zone. The project site is located at 121, 123, and 125 South Church Street (APN: 094-298-016).

Staff presented its report and recommended that the HPAC approve the request as conditioned and modified by staff. Public comment in favor of the proposal was provided by project consultant Eddie Sisto. No other public comment was received.

The HPAC asked questions concerning signage on the awnings. The applicant stated there would be no signage proposed. After discussion of the project, a motion was made by Hohlbauch, seconded by Lusk, to approve the request as recommended by staff. The motion passed by a vote of 6-0

C. <u>HPAC Item No. 2025-10</u>: A request by Cain Infante to replace comp shingle roofing material on an existing residence with tile roofing material, and install a chain link fence, for a site located within the R-1-5 (Single Family Residential, 5,000 square foot minimum site area) Zone. The project site is located at 407 Northeast 1st Avenue (APN: 094-085-003).

Staff presented its report and recommended that the HPAC approve the request as conditioned by staff, with a recommendation to add a condition of approval requiring issuance of a Building Permit for the work conducted within 30 days of the decision of the HPAC. Public comment in favor of the proposal was provided by property owners Cain Infante and Norma Aguilar. No other public comment was received.

In both English and Spanish, the HPAC and applicants discussed why the requested improvements where necessary, as well as some of the history behind the residence. Clarifications were also made regarding whether existing wood fencing would remain. Lastly the HPAC and applicants discussed future modifications to the windows of the residence, encouraging the applicant to go through the permitting process prior to installation. Melgar also requested that the HPAC Informational Guide be provided to the property owners for review. After discussion of the project, a motion was made by Hohlbauch to approve the request, with an added condition requiring the applicant to obtain a Building Permit for all work conducted within 30 days of the decision of the HPAC. The motion was seconded by Arriaga and passed by a vote of 6-0

After Hohlbauch confirmed that he wished to continue serving on the HPAC, a motion was made by Melgar, seconded by Hohlbauch, to recommend to the Visalia City Council that Ayala, Hohlbauch, and Lusk be reappointed to the HPAC. The motion was approved 6-0.

B. Review of New Committee Member Applications – June 25, 2025

Staff informed HPAC that it had received 5 applications so far and that interviews would occur June 25, 2025.

C. Cancellation of June 11, 2025, HPAC Meeting

A motion was made by Lusk, seconded by Ayala, to approve the cancellation of the June 11, 2025, HPAC meeting. The motion was approved 6-0.

D. June 2, 2025, City Council Meeting – Approval of the Revised Resolution Upholding the Appeal of HPAC Item No. 2025-05.

Staff informed the HPAC that a revised resolution upholding the appeal, reversing the denial of a window change out at 410 North Court Street, would be heard by the Visalia City Council June 2, 2025. Staff stated that all the conditions applied by staff during the HPAC's initial review regarding window screens and dining room windows would be carried over in the revised resolution.

E. Revisions to 2025-2026 HPAC Goals

The Committee revised Goals 4.a (Outreach to the Tulare County Association of Realtors) to September 2025, and revised Goal 2.c (Establish a Certified Local Government program) to December 2026. A motion was then made by Melgar, seconded by Ayala, to approve the revised 2025-2026 goals. The motion was approved 6-0.

F. Approval of Historic Recognition/Awards Program

Davis discussed setting up a meeting with staff, Lusk, and Planning and Community Preservation Director Paul Bernal to discuss the formulation of an awards program. He noted that Visalia Heritage would take the mantle from the Kaweah Kollectors/Questors to award plaques via the Historic Recognition Program. Ayala stated that HPAC should have the goal of presenting Historic Presentation awards by May 2026.

G. Historic District Survey Project Update

Davis stated that he, Melgar, and Arriaga would be conducting a survey of the Martin Street area within the next two weeks.

H. Committee and Staff Comments

i. Project Updates

Staff and the Committee discussed various projects within the Historic District and Local Register, including unpermitted work being conducted at 630 North Encina Street, and recently completed work at 501 South Court Street.

I. Identification of Items for Future Agendas

During this time City Manager Leslie Caviglia encourage the HPAC to attend the Committees/Commissions Recognition Event on June 18, 2025, at Rawhide Stadium, Visalia CA.

project site is located at 630 North Encina Street (APN: 094-013-004).

STAFF RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends that the Historic Preservation Advisory Committee (HPAC) approve the proposal as modified in the findings and conditions of this report.

SITE DATA

The site is zoned R-1-5 and currently contains a single-family residence and a detached garage. The site is located within the Historic District and is listed on the



Local Register of Historic Structures with a classification of "Background". The structures onsite exhibit "Period Revival" and "Tudor Revival" architectural elements.

PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The applicant is requesting approval to conduct the following exterior alterations to a detached garage:

- 1. Remove the existing wood siding on the left and right sides of the single-car garage door (see Exhibit "B").
- 2. Remove the existing garage door, enlarge the entrance to accommodate two vehicles, and install a new 15-foot, 11-inch by 6-foot, 10-inch, Invicta 400 Series "Short Carriage House Panel" garage door (see Exhibit "C").

Repairs will also be conducted to the stucco on the garage, in particular along its western exterior, which was damaged by a basketball hoop that has since been removed. The applicant states that the removal of the wood siding panels is necessary because the material is not appropriate for the site. The applicant also states that enlargement of the garage door opening allows the structure to be used for the parking of two vehicles.

Interior and exterior alterations were conducted around May 2025 to the main residence onsite without building permits or HPAC review and are the subject of an ongoing Code Enforcement Case (CE250637). The applicant has since obtained a Building Permit for the alterations to the residence (B252391), issued June 2, 2025. Exterior alterations proposed to the garage have not yet been conducted.

DISCUSSION

Development Standards


Exterior alterations proposed to the detached garage will not result in an increase in the square footage of the structure. As such, the proposal complies with all development standards of the R-1-5 Zone.

Architectural Compatibility

Visalia Municipal Code (VMC) Section 17.56.110 contains criteria for review of exterior alterations to structures listed on the Local Register. Criteria is aimed towards preserving original and distinguishing features of Local Register structures. This includes emphasis on the following:

- The distinguishing original qualities or character of a building, structure, or site and its
 environment shall not be destroyed. The removal or alteration of any historic material
 or distinctive architectural features should be avoided when possible.
- Distinctive stylistic features or examples of skilled craftsmanship, which characterize a building, structure or site, shall be treated with sensitivity.
- Deteriorated architectural features shall be repaired rather than replaced, wherever possible. In the event replacement is necessary, the new material should match the material being replaced in composition, design, color, texture and other visual qualities. Repair or replacement of missing architectural features should be based on accurate duplications of features, substantiated by historical, physical or pictorial evidence rather than on conjectural designs or the availability of different architectural elements from other buildings or structures.

The existing garage door treatment has been present onsite since at least the 1970's (see Historic District survey photograph in Figure 1). However, staff concurs with the applicant that



existing vertical the wood siding and garage door clash with the overall design of the residence, which contains no other design elements similar the garage door/siding. Removal would have the effect of eliminating a discordant element from the project site, improving compatibility between residence the and garage.

In order to strengthen the architectural integrity of the structure, as well as further increase compatibility between the garage and residence, staff recommends the inclusion of Condition No. 2, requiring that the new garage door be made of either wood, or a material that retains the appearance of wood. This could include a metal material with wood like grain and/or coloration. This would reinforce the Tudor style of the garage, as Tudor structures often contain wood elements, such as half-timbered exterior facades and wood trim. To that effect, staff also recommends the addition of Condition No. 3, requiring that a wooden border be maintained along the perimeter of the garage door, similar to what currently exists on the garage (see Exhibit "B"). With application of both conditions the goals of VMC Sec. 17.56.110 will be achieved, as the structures on the project site will be internally harmonious, and in keeping with the historic aesthetic of the surrounding neighborhood.

FINDINGS AND CONDITIONS

For HPAC Item No. 2025-11 staff recommends that the Committee approve the proposal, subject to the findings and conditions listed below:

Findings

- 1. That the project site is within the Historic District and is listed on the Local Register of Historic Structures.
- 2. That the proposal as conditioned is consistent with uses onsite, the surrounding area, and the Historic District.
- 3. That the proposal as conditioned is consistent with the Historic Preservation Ordinance and Historic Preservation Element.
- 4. That the proposal as conditioned will not be injurious site or the character of the Historic District.

Conditions

- 1. That the proposal shall be developed in compliance with the site plan in Exhibit "A", building elevations in Exhibit "C", and project application in Exhibit "D", except as modified by the conditions below.
- 2. That the replacement garage door shall be constructed of wood or wood-like materials to complement and enhance the garages Period Revival architectural style.
- 3. That a wooden border be placed along the perimeter of the garage door opening, similar in size and shape to the original border depicted in Exhibit "B".
- 4. That the project undergoes the appropriate City permitting process for exterior alterations and fencing on the project site.
- 5. That any other exterior alterations to the site shall be brought before this Committee for review and approval prior to the issuance of any Building Permits and/or their installation or construction.
- 6. That all other City codes, ordinances, standards, and regulations shall be met.
- 7. That the approval from the Historic Preservation Advisory Committee shall lapse and become void twelve months after the date on which it became effective, unless the conditions of the approval allowed a shorter or greater time limit, or unless prior to the expiration of twelve months a building permit is issued by the city and construction is commenced and diligently pursued toward completion on the site that was the subject of the approval.


