Visalia PD's PAL Program & A Father's Love Fuel Jennah "The Gem" Creason's Rise to Headline Valley Fight Series 21

This Saturday night, Jennah "The Gem" Creason will do more than just step into the ring at Valley Fight Series 21. She will carry with her the strength of a father's love and the support of a community that believed in her from day one. The 19-year-old professional boxer from Visalia, California will headline the event at Table Mountain Casino Resort, facing off against Alivia Bierley in what promises to be an inspiring moment for Central Valley fight fans.

Raised by a single father, Jennah's story is not just about punches and titles, it's about perseverance, purpose, and the power of family. "My dad probably had the harder job than I did," Jennah said. "He raised me by himself. Since I was two months old, it's been just him and me. He taught me to be strong. Independent. Focused. Everything I am today, is because of him."

While her older brothers boxed, her father was hesitant to let his youngest daughter enter the ring. But Jennah had something in her that couldn't be held back. "He didn't want to see his little girl get punched," she said. "But I fell in love with it. I basically live in the gym now." And while her dad shaped her mindset, it was the Visalia Police Activities League (PAL), a program ran by local officers like Art Villareal of the Visalia Police Department, that gave Jennah the tools, training, and belief to chase her dreams. "Without Visalia PAL, I wouldn't be boxing today," Jennah said. "They helped me get to nationals. They helped me compete internationally. They gave me a second home, and now I'm proud to serve on their board and give back."

From three national titles to a gold medal with Team USA, Jennah has proven herself on some of the sport's biggest stages. This was done all while finishing high school and turning professional at just 18 years old. Her story is one of faith, family, and fighting for something bigger than herself.

"People ask me where my discipline comes from, and they think I have a military background. But really, it was my dad. It was PAL. They made me who I am."

Jennah "The Gem" Creason now stands as a role model for young athletes across the Valley. A symbol of what happens when a father never gives up, and when a community steps in to lift a child higher.
