Federal	LIHTC	Low-Income Housing Tax Credit (LIHTC)	The primary equity source for affordable rental housing nationwide. In California, credits are allocated through the California Tax Credit Allocation Committee and are commonly paired with state and local gap financing.		
Federal	NHTF	National Housing Trust Fund	State-administered funding targeted to extremely low-income households, frequently used as gap financing for rental housing projects.		
Federal	PBV	Project Based Vouchers	Project-based vouchers (PBVs) are a component of a public housing agency's (PHA's) Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) program. Federal	SRA	Section 8 Rental Assistance	Housing Choice Vouchers and Project-Based Vouchers provide long-term operating subsidies that are critical for serving extremely low-income households, seniors, persons with disabilities, and supportive housing residents.		
Federal	SSHSD	Section 811 Supportive Housing for Persons with Disabilities	Supports affordable housing linked with services for persons with disabilities, often paired with state capital funding.		
Federal	VASH	Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing	The HUD-Veterans Affairs Supportive Housing (HUD-VASH) program combines HUD's Housing Choice Voucher (HCV) rental assistance for homeless Veterans with case management and clinical services provided by the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA).
