1. Updated discussion on the Business Research Park (BRP) zone and potential moratorium on BRP-zoned land in the vicinity of Plaza Drive, north of Hwy 198.

Paul Scheibel, Planning Services Manager, presented staff's three recommendations and a recommendation not to implement a zoning moratorium.

AS/BL 5-0 Item 12 approved as amended. 12. Report on FEMA's revised Flood Insurance Study and Flood Insurance Rate Maps for Tulare County to be effective on June 16, 2009.

Chris Young, Assistant Community Development Director presented the staff report and a composite map showing the properties that have come out of the flood zone (7900) and the properties that are now in the flood zone (8900). Mr. Young reviewed the map process (timeline) and the timeline for protests and appeals. 22 protests were filed and 18 of those were upheld by FEMA. The period for administrative appeal and judicial review has passed. Mr. Young indicated it would be an uphill battle to challenge the methodology of FEMA.

City Attorney Alex Peltzer discussed the potential for a legal challenge and found no opportunity for the city to file an appeal or court action on its own initiative.
