WANT TO DO BUSINESS WITH THE CITY?: Businesses throughout Tulare County are encouraged to registered with the City of Visalia. The City wants to know what type of products and services local firms can provide. At Monday night's meeting, as part of a local purchasing preference, the Council discussed outreach to local businesses. Local businesses will have an opportunity to match pricing with state or national contracts, and under certain circumstances, will allow a local vendor who is within 5% of the low bid from an outside firm to match the bid. GENERAL FUND BUDGET DECLINES FOR THIRD STRAIGHT YEAR:

The City Council received the proposed 2010-11 and 11-12 budgets this week. While the total budget is one of the largest in the history of the City, \$191 million for 2010-11, that figure comprises all funds including capital projects such as the upcoming waste water treatment plant upgrade, and enterprise funds such as solid waste and airport which have designated revenues sources separate from the General Fund (GF). The General Fund Budget is down \$4.3 million from just two years ago. The proposed GF budget is \$55,854,740, which is a \$3.8 million shortfall from expected revenues. To balance the budget, the Council is looking at using reserves (\$1.2 million), increasing revenues through a tow service franchise fee (\$100,000), reducing non-profit organization grants (\$60,000) and employee compensation concessions or use of further reserves (\$2.4 million). The Council will consider the budget on Monday, June 28 at the Convention Center.

LOOK FOR CHANGES IN BUS SERVICE: The Transit Committee will host a public meeting on July 7 at 5:30 p.m. at the Transit Center to discuss the changes to bus and trolley service that will be implemented in August. The changes address, among other things, the expansion of Route 7 (north/east Visalia) north on Dinuba to include the Orchard Walk shopping center. To offset this increased cost, the Green Trolley line will be eliminated due to the fact that it duplicates service already provided by the larger fixed route buses. In addition, the Blue and Gold Trolley Routes will change. Rather than operating on Main and Center as they do now, they will operate on Main and Acequia as to provide more readily available service to high traffic generators such as the hospital, the two parking structures, two hotels and the Convention Center.

POOL WATCH: It's that time of year again where we need to be aware of three pool related issues. The law requires all pools be secured with a 5-foot fence. Pools that are not properly maintained tend to attract mosquito breeding which can promote the spread of West Nile Virus. If you know of any unprotected or improperly maintained pools in your neighborhood, notify the City's Neighborhood Preservation Division at 713-4534. Provide the address of the property, whether there is water in the pool, and if there is secured fencing around the pool. If you need to report an unsecured pool during the weekend, contact the Visalia Fire Department at 734-8117.

NO CHANGE IN REFUSE SERVICE OVER HOLIDAY: City of Visalia business offices will be closed on Monday July 5 in observance of the Independence Day Holiday. There will be no change in either residential or commercial refuse service.
