GARBAGE



Place all of these items in the gray lid garbage can:

- Aluminum foil** *contaminated with food*
- Candy wrappers**
- Cardboard roll/box with plastic wrap attached**
- Ceramics, porcelain and china** *(anything made of clay/glazed)*
- Clothing, fabric, and shoes**
 - *Alternatively, repurpose or donate to a thrift store*
- Diapers** *(clean or dirty)*
- Pet & Animal Waste**
- Dryer lint and dryer sheets**
- Juice boxes and foil or coated-paper drink pouches**
 - *(Flavored drinks, Hi-C, Juicy Juice, or Capri Sun, etc.)*
 - *Made of more than one material, not recyclable*
- Meats, dairy, fish, poultry, seafood, etc.**
- Mirrors**
- Potato chip or foil cookie bags**
 - *Made of more than one material, not recyclable*
- Sandwich, storage, sealable, and dirty plastic bags**
- Windows** *(broken and auto windows)*
 - *Reusable construction windows – consider donating to Habitat for Humanity's ReStore*



Polystyrene foam

(Place pellets into bag and seal)
Clean polystyrene may be delivered to **Tempo Plastic** (see info below) or dropped off at the next **City of Visalia Dump On Us** event.

PALM TREES AND FRONDS

Deliver palm trees and fronds to **WC Wood Industries**, or cut them up and place in garbage

Palms, bamboo, or yucca

- Cut into small pieces
- Place pieces in garbage container
- Remember not to overfill the container
- **The lid must close**

RECYCLING



Place all of these items in the blue lid recyclables can:

PAPER

- Office paper**
 - *Staples are okay, remove paper clips*
- Cardboard, cereal, gift, and shoe boxes** *(always flatten boxes)*
- Catalogs, junk mail, magazines, and newspapers**
- Chipboard boxes** *(always flatten boxes)*
 - *Cracker, cereal, crayon, detergent boxes, etc.*
- Plastic milk cartons**
- Paper bags** *(place dirty paper bags in green waste)*
- Paper egg cartons**
- Post-It Notes, shredded paper** *(place into bags and seal)*
- Poster board**
- Telephone books**
- Wrapping paper**
- NO foil-lined paper** *(place in garbage)*
- NO wax paper** *(place in green waste)*

CANS

- Empty containers**
- Aluminum cans, steel/tin cans**
 - *Soup, vegetable, fruit, pet food, etc.*
- Aluminum foil** - *clean only*

GLASS

- Glass bottles, jars and lids**
 - *Applesauce, pasta sauce, juice, tea, beer, wine, colored-glass bottles, etc.*
 - *Remove lid and empty containers*

PLASTIC

- Plastic bottles, containers and lids**
 - *Milk, juice, bleach, liquid detergent, shampoo, drink bottles, etc.*
 - *Empty all containers*
- Plastic, non-foam plates, cups, and utensils**
 - *Plates, cups, or utensils with this symbol are made from polystyrene and are to be placed in the garbage can*
- Dry-cleaning bags**
- Clean plastic grocery or green waste bags**

ALL GLASS or PLASTIC BOTTLES with "CRV" "CA Redemption Value" or "CARefund" Any plastic with the following recycling symbols:



GREEN WASTE & FOOD SCRAPS



Place all of these items in the green lid organics/green waste can:

YARD TRIMMINGS

- Branches and tree trimmings**
- Cactus**
- Flowers and floral trimmings**
- Grasses, weeds, and leaves**
- Potting soil**
- NO palms, bamboo, or yucca**
- NO pots, plastic bags, flats, or packs**

FOOD ITEMS

- Bakery goods, bread, grains, and tortillas**
- Beans, lentils, and other legumes**
- Coffee grounds and tea leaves**
- Eggshells**
- Flour products** *(including paper box or bag)*
- Fruit and vegetables** *(raw and cooked, pits too)*
- Nuts and nutshells**
- Pasta, noodles, and rice**
- Popcorn**
- Soup**
- NO proteins** *Meats, dairy, fish, poultry, or seafood (raw or cooked, including bones) are to be placed in the garbage can*

USED/FOOD SOILED PAPER

- Paper coffee filters and paper tea bags**
- Paper ice cream containers** *(metal rim is okay)*
- Used paper bags, plates, cups napkins, tissues, and towels**
- Pizza boxes** *(tear into quarters)*
- Paper take-out containers**
- Wax paper**
- NO straws, utensils, polystyrene, or plastics**
- NO clean paper or cardboard**
 - *Place clean paper items in blue lid recyclables can*

OTHER

- Corks** *(Wood ONLY)*
- Lumber** *(small pieces of lumber or sawdust from unfinished wood ONLY)*
- Vegetable or fruit** *(paper and wood crates)*
- Wax-coated, paper containers**
 - *Paper milk cartons, TV dinner containers (used paper boxes ONLY)*
- Wood Pallets** *(nails/staples okay)*
- NO painted, stained or treated wood**
